Divine Mercy SundayMy Lord and My God: In today's Gospel, the disciples have locked themselves in a room out of fear. Jesus comes and stands among them and says "Peace be with you". The disciples are filled with joy when they see him! Last Sunday the tomb was found empty. And now the resurrected Jesus is alive and with His disciples once again. He gives them the Holy Spirit and the power to be able to forgive sins. Thomas doesn't believe that it really is Jesus

so Jesus shows him the wounds on his hands from the nails and the hole in his side. Then Thomas believes and he says "My Lord and my God!" We too can be sure that Jesus really did rise from the dead and that Jesus is indeed God.

Feast of the Week: St. Faustina was a Polish nun who was asked by Jesus to remind the world of his Divine Mercy. God's mercy is greater than any sin. This was proclaimed in a special way by St. Pope John Paul II. He announced that the second Sunday of Easter would become Divine Mercy Sunday. St. John Paul died on April 2nd 2005, on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday

POPE FRANCIS ON DIVINE MERCY

The Church is not a museum of saints, but a hospital for sinners. I see clearly that the thing the Church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds. And you have to start from the

ground up.

The Church sometimes has locked itself up in small things, in small-minded rules. The most important thing is the first proclamation: Jesus Christ has saved you. And the ministers of the Church must be ministers of mercy above all. The confessor, for example, is always in danger of being either too much of a rigorist or too lax. Neither is merciful, because neither of them really takes responsibility for the person. The rigorist washes his hands so that he leaves it to the commandment. The loose minister washes his hands by simply saying, "This is not a sin" or something like that.
